

FLAG DAY

We celebrate Flag Day on June 14, the anniversary of Old Glory's adoption as America's flag in 1777. The U.S. Flag Code outlines how this national symbol should be honored.

The Stars and Stripes always flies at the peak of a staff, higher than any other flag when on the same pole. When multiple flags are flown on separate poles, the U.S. flag is hoisted first and placed to the observer's far left. The flag should not touch anything beneath it, such as the ground or floor. Unless properly lit, the flag is lowered—slowly and ceremoniously and brought indoors at sundown.

When in uniform, members of the military and police and fire departments salute the flag when it's being hoisted or lowered or passes by in a parade. Military members who are out of uniform and veterans may also salute. Civilians should show their respect by placing their right hand over their heart and removing their hats.

When an American flag is worn or faded, it should be retired in a flag-burning ceremony. The American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops, and other organizations perform these ceremonies as a community service.



HAPPY FATHER'S DAY

Father's Day is Sunday, June 21st. But did you know it took a mother to bring equity to fathers?

As she sat in church more than 100 years ago in Spokane, Wash., Sonora Smart Dodd listened to a sermon about Mother's Day. It made her wonder why there was no Father's Day. Dodd, one of six children, was determined to find a way to honor her father, who raised the family after Dodd's mother died. That year, 1909, Dodd took her concerns to the Spokane Ministerial Alliance and suggested that fathers have their day. Her idea gained support. On June 19, 1910, Spokane recognized the first Father's Day on record. Dodd, who had a son of her own, must have appreciated it when President Calvin Coolidge approved a nationwide celebration of Father's Day in 1924.

So, to all the fathers out there, Happy Father's Day.





Open-Faced BLT Sandwiches Ingredients:

- 6 to 8 strips bacon
- 1 loaf country bread
- 1 cup arugula leaves
- 1 cup cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil, plus additional to drizzle
- 1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar
- · Kosher salt
- · Ground pepper

Directions:

Heat oven to 375° F. Place bacon on baking sheet and bake 15 to 20 minutes, depending on thickness of bacon. Remove bacon from oven and transfer to paper towels to drain.

Using bread knife, slice bread 1/3-inch thick into single-serving slices; toast lightly.

Add arugula leaves and cherry tomatoes to medium bowl. In separate bowl, whisk olive oil and balsamic vinegar. Add to arugula and tomatoes and toss gently to coat.

To assemble, drizzle olive oil on one side of toasted bread. Arrange bacon and arugula and tomato mixture on top. Finish each sandwich with a sprinkle of salt and pepper.
